

Eurorebus



Eurorebus is a competition for grades 6 to 13 (high school) students. Its focus is on general knowledge, the competition has no topic. The 21st season was held in the 2015/2016 school year.

The competition has two forms:

- Competition of the individuals (every single student competes for himself)
- Competition of the school classes (in the higher rounds a three-member team competes on behalf of the class)

All participants are divided into three categories:

- ZŠ01 (grades 6 and 7)
- ZŠ02 (grades 8 and 9)
- SŠ (grades 9 to 13)

The competition runs through the so-called Correspondence and Electronic rounds (it is necessary to register on the website in order to compete). The correct answers are rewarded with a certain amount of points for the individuals, as well as for the class and school. The points determine the participants who will take part in the regional rounds, participants can also order some rewards from the catalogue for their points. The points can be also gained with the Bonus tests, Supporting games and Today's energetic world test via the Internet, too. The participants and classes with the biggest amounts of points are then invited to the regional rounds - there they will be writing a multiple-choice test. The best participants will advance to the national round. In the national round it is decided who are the overall winners. It is also decided which school is the most successful and that school gets the Eurorebus Cup. The main prize for the most successful individuals and classes is the Eurorebus expedition - a trip to an European country.
